Pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-22-2-32:

The attorney general has forty-five (45) days from the date that an agency:

- (1) submits a rule under section 31 of this chapter; or
- (2) resubmits a rule under subsection (e);

to approve or disapprove the rule. If the attorney general neither approves nor disapproves the rule, the rule is deemed approved, and the agency may submit it to the governor for approval under section 33 [IC 4-22-2-33] of this chapter without the approval of the attorney general.

After a rule is approved by the attorney general, the governor reviews the rule and may approve or disapprove a rule. Pursuant to Ind. Code 4-22-2-34:

The governor has fifteen (15) days from the date that an agency submits a rule under section 33 of this chapter to approve or disapprove the rule. However, the governor may take thirty (30) days to approve or disapprove the rule if the governor files a statement with the publisher within the first fifteen (15) days after an agency submits the rule that states that the governor intends to take an additional fifteen (15) days to approve or disapprove the rule. If the governor neither approves nor disapproves the rule within the allowed period, the rule is deemed approved, and the agency may submit the rule to the publisher without the approval of the governor.
